An hour-long detour! If I had known it would be the last time we saw him, maybe I would not have been so annoyed! Both these bulls will be sorely missed.

We also unfortunately had 2 or our de-horned rhinos poached in November!

Happier news - In December Rain's two female cubs were relocated to Malawi. This was done in collaboration between The Pilanesberg Wildlife Trust and the Endangered Wildlife Trust and helps to grow the Cheetah populations outside of South Africa. It also assists with diversity of our population in the Pilanesberg as both these females are related to the males in the park. The relocation went well and last reports were that both ladies are doing well in their new home.

I am not one for new years resolutions, however, this year I have "resolved" to change the timings of the newsletter and will be sending this out every 2 months instead of every quarter, or as in 2020 whenever there was news!

Tlou Drive was cleared from The Pilanesberg Centre to Ruighoek Dam.


Fire extinguishers were installed in the Manyane Tents and in Potokwane – with full signage.

• Makorwane Hide.

- Mesh fencing and shade cloth covers along the walkway were repaired or replaced where necessary.
- New shelving was fitted, and existing supports repaired where necessary,
- Decking planks were replaced where necessary, and new underfloor supports were fitted.
- Some trimming in the carpark was done.
- The hide is looking neat and tidy again. We will need to do a repaint on the outside sometime soon, but not critical yet.

• Road Clearing.

• Tshukudu e'Ntsho was cleared from the cairn at Tlou Pans up to the causeway at Makorwane Dam.

• Rathlogo Hide / Malatse Walkway.

- The overhead covering at Malatse Bridge walkway was repaired (a new cross piece was fitted, and the mesh re-attached).
- Existing fencing at Rathlogo Walkway was worked on, with damaged structures replaced, loose droppers fastened, and a general tidy and repair of the fencing was done.
- A section of fencing on the Northern side of the car-park entrance was repaired (again, after it was done last work-party), and has since been knocked over (again). We need to reconsider this section.
- Roof sheeting on the hide was fixed using new roofing screws. Reports indicate that a section on the hide entrance is still loose, and needs to be looked at again.

- We looked into using the existing solar panel / charge controller / battery set-up from the redundant booster pump as a charging station for our power tools. This seems to be working well. A bit of shelving would finish the job.
- Another member of FOPS has officially joined the OAP ranks, and many thanks to Debbi, Lauren and all of our work-party members for a very special evening on Friday night it was much appreciated.
- Project List.
 - Rathlogo Hide
 - Fencing must be completed. The fence repairs are on-going, but not urgent.
 - Fit additional bracing and foundations to the underside of the hide. A donation has been received towards this work (R23K), and Ken Loveland will be looking into the foundations as soon as his personal circumstances allow. Hopefully this will be done before the rains start.
 - Malatse Bridge
 - Bridge designs need to be finalised and final costings done. The budget of R40K seems fair for now.
